Pastor David's Message



The Poppy

I believe everyone should wear a poppy. It reminds us and others that this is a visual pledge, that we are never to forget all those who sacrificed and served to make this country free. The poppy campaign is important, not only does it help people to receive poppies, but it helps to raise funds to support the legion and their work, including helping our veterans and their families. The poppy symbol was inspired by the poem, "In Flanders Fields."

In Flanders Fields

by Lieutenant-Colonel John McCrae - May 3, 1915
In Flanders fields the poppies blow
Between the crosses, row on row,
That mark our place; and in the sky
The larks, still bravely singing, fly
Scarce heard amid the guns below.
We are the Dead. Short days ago
We lived, felt dawn, saw sunset glow,
Loved and were loved, and now we lie
In Flanders fields.

Take up our quarrel with the foe:
To you from failing hands we throw
The torch; be yours to hold it high.
If ye break faith with us who die
We shall not sleep, though poppies grow
In Flanders fields.

(As published in Punch Magazine, December 8, 1915)

In 1921, Madame Anna Guerin of France was inspired by this poem and made poppies from fabric and sold them to raise funds to rebuild regions of France that were affected by the first world war. From there it caught on to other regions in the world. May we wear the poppy to remember, that War is always a heavy price to pay and that we are always ones that should find a possible path to peace. I think of the lives lost in the past and how those who lost their lives never got to enjoy what we at times take for granted. I think of the conflicts the world faces now and those displaced like our Ukrainian families that are with us. It grieves our hearts and God's. I feel that generations need to remember, when we remember it gives me hope that war can be averted. In times like these we need to turn to the Lord for guidance and help.


Ukrainian Humanitarian Mission Fund UPDATE



GRACE COFFEE SOCIAL




