Pastor David's Message

The Bible

From the learning about our faith series.

Question: Pastor David why do Christians call their most sacred book the bible?

Answer: I would like to say that the bible means: **B**asic Instructions **B**efore Leaving Earth. The bible really received its name from the Greek name "biblia", meaning books. The bible is not one book, but it is a collection of 66 separate books that work together and support one another.

Question: Who is the author of the bible and is it God's word to us?

Answer: There are as many as forty different writers who have placed the letters and words down in the bible. These are not of their thoughts or opinions. God had spoken and directed them to write these words.

Question: Is the King James Bible the best bible to read?

Answer: There is nothing wrong with the King James Bible, however there are also good translations out there like the NIV. The best source to read the bible is to read the original language that it is written in. The original language in the Old Testament was written mainly in Hebrew with some Aramaic. The original language of the New Testament is Greek. If you do not know these languages, it is ok, because we have very good English translations to read and help us understand.

Question: How was the Old Testament put together?

Answer: God's people known as the Hebrews had a flawless way to pass down the biblical stories and events. Eventually Moses around 1400 B.C. with God's divine guidance had edited and written these stories down. The other scriptural text was collected by other Jewish authors over the next thousand years. Around 450 BC, a council of rabbis guided by the Holy Spirit, agreed that these texts are the inspired and sacred authority of the divine creator. These scriptures were copied over the years with extreme accuracy. If a copy had a mistake, it was thrown out. The scribes had extreme methods to keep the holy word in its full purity. This method was continued until the invention of the printing press. One of the oldest copies of the Old Testament is the famous Dead Sea Scrolls. When they were found and compared to the scriptures today it confirmed how diligent and reliable the scribal system was.

Question: How was the New Testament put together?

Answer: After 400 years of scriptural silence, Jesus Christ our Saviour had finally come to fulfil the scriptural promise. In His message He gave us a New Testament or New Covenant. Around 40 A.D. to 90 A.D. his disciples and eye witnesses like Matthew, Mark, Luke, John, Paul, James Peter and Jude wrote these passages down. These passages eventually became the New Testament. As Christians we see this chosen text as the inspired word of God.

Question: Is the bible really reliable, and should we take it seriously.

Answer: Yes absolutely, without a doubt. The bible in its complete form is the best-preserved literary work of all antiquity. The bible is the most reliable ancient book we have. We are blessed to have over 24000 ancient manuscripts to support its existence. No other work of antiquity has been more scrutinized and studied then the bible. Remember and recall what 2 Timothy 3:15-17 says: "and how from infancy you have known the holy Scriptures, which are able to make you wise for salvation through faith in Christ Jesus. All Scripture is Godbreathed and is useful for teaching, rebuking, correcting and training in righteousness, so that the man of God may be thoroughly equipped for every good work. NIV

Remember, to really believe that the bible is real for you, God also needs to breathe his Holy Spirit into you. Ask and you will receive.

It is a blessing to know and read his Word.


