Pastor David's Message

Question and answer session with Pastor David

Why do we celebrate Christmas and does Jesus need to be a part of it?

ILT EDUCATION:

Where Will Your Next Pastor Come From?

We are all familiar with the traditional model of selecting a new pastor, which involved a pipeline that included Bible camps, Bible colleges, and seminaries. Students would attend seminary and then relocate to a church elsewhere that extended a call. Congregations would apply to seminaries, and a seminary would send them a suitable candidate.

However, we are experiencing a transitional period where these old pipelines for training pastors no longer exist, resulting in congregations struggling to find pastors. Bible camps and colleges are in decline, and fewer Christian young people aspire to become pastors. The higher cost of seminary education and the lengthy process discourage many potential candidates. This has resulted in most of today's seminary students being non-traditional, often second-career individuals who are stepping forward to serve their local congregations.

Addressing these challenges necessitates a new model of education, one that ILT has already successfully pioneered. Our certificate and degree programs are tailored to train individuals regardless of their prior educational background. ILT assists students in selecting the most appropriate program to prepare them for ministry and provides mentorship to support their transition into pastoral roles. Many students start serving their congregations before completing their studies, balancing employment and coursework. The result is a combination of academic excellence and practical apprenticeship.

This innovative model represents a significant advancement for Lutheran congregations across North America, and it is already proving effective, one pastor at a time. The traditional internship and candidate lists are no longer viable. The next pastor of your local church could very well be someone already sitting in the congregation, ready to serve and lead from within.
