

Pastor David's Message

Freedom of Religion and Expression

I believe in these two terms, even if it means at times that my expression or religion may not always agree with someone else. The issue is when one side takes dominance and shuts the other side down or makes one voiceless. This is what happened in Germany during the Nazis' regime or in the Soviet Union. We have places in the world today like North Korea and other places where one cannot freely express their beliefs. These two terms hold the key to healthy government and education. We want to teach people how to think, to seek truth, and not force belief and expression on them. Truth is freely more accepted when it is given in a loving way that is not forceful. Jesus was one to express a new way for humanity to think and to believe. He was often challenged by the authorities and in the end was crucified for it. We live in a more polarizing time and many feel threatened in their beliefs even if it might be a different spectrum. Some have not always put their best foot forward in expression and have caused issues. We always ask, how do we prevent such things to be expressed? I don't know, because when we try, we may also silence others in their expressions when there maybe value to their views. Its complicated, and part of these freedoms do come with a price. The age of reason always changes therefore we can disagree but, we can do what Jesus' spoke of. To love your enemy and to treat those in how you may want to be treated.

Mark 12:31 The second is this: 'Love your neighbour as yourself. There is no commandment greater than these. "NIV

Galatians 5:14

For the entire law is fulfilled in keeping this one command: "Love your neighbour as yourself. NIV

James 2:8 If you really keep the royal law found in Scripture, "Love your neighbour as yourself, "you are doing right. NIV

Romans 13:10

Love does no harm to a neighbour. Therefore, love is the fulfillment of the law. NIV

Freedom of Religious Expression could be threatened by a government Bill currently before Parliament.

Bill C-9 entitled the Combatting Hate Act was given second reading (support in principle) by the House of Commons and has been in Committee for detailed study since the beginning of October.

The Bill's expressed intention is to further curb hate speech which in principle many of us could support. However, in an attempt to do so, it seriously threatens religious expression by denying its protection that is provided for other forms of expression including artistic and scientific. This is being done by a proposed amendment to the Bill sponsored by the Bloc and supported by the government. Religious expression and institutions are thus being targeted for tougher and potentially repressive measures.

As the Bill is still in Committee, there is still time to contact your local MP and urge that this amendment be rejected by the Committee before the Bill is reported back to the House.




